

GREATER CHAPIN COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT GUIDELINES

WHO WE ARE

Greater Chapin Community Foundation is a publicly funded endowment founded by and for the people living in Chapin, Ballentine, White Rock, Peak, Prosperity and other nearby communities. GCCF provides grants for a broad range of charitable needs in this community. The goal of GCCF is to encourage the generosity of people today so that this area will have permanent endowed resources to address needs from generation to generation.

WHAT ARE GREATER CHAPIN COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANTS?

Greater Chapin Community Foundation grants address a broad range of charitable needs for the greater Chapin community. The goal of the grants are to uplift and strengthen organizations who are addressing critical needs within the greater Chapin area.

Greater Chapin Community Foundation is looking for organizations that:

- **Develop competencies and skills enabling individuals to live fuller, more productive lives in the Greater Chapin community**
- **Leverage other funding through the use of matching grants**
- **Provide opportunities for underserved populations**
- **Demonstrate systems or approaches to build on individual, family, or community strengths**

WHAT WE WILL NOT FUND

- Debt reduction
- Endowment or capital campaigns
- Medical research
- Projects that restrict participation on the basis of race, color, religion, age, national origin, disability, marital status, parental status, military status, sexual orientation, gender, or gender expression.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Organizations must be determined as a charitable organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, public entities or other charitable, educational or faith-based organizations.
- Organizations must serve the Greater Chapin area: Ballentine, Chapin, Little Mountain, Peak, Prosperity and White Rock.
- If awarded a grant, an organization must agree to recognize the Greater Chapin Community Endowment as the source of the award, and share on all forms of social media in which the organization participates, in press releases or news coverage of events, and listed as a sponsor on promotional information.

GRANT AMOUNT

There is not a maximum grant request amount, however the average amount of grants awarded in the previous year was \$1,000.

GRANT PERIOD

February 1st – February 29th

DEADLINE DATE

February 29, 2020 by 11:59 p.m.

HOW TO APPLY

Interested organizations may apply online at www.yourfoundation.org under the Nonprofit section. Mailed, emailed, faxed or hand delivered applications will not be accepted.

Prior to applying, organizations are encouraged to thoroughly review all information about this grant on the Community Foundation's website.

REVIEW PROCESS

Applications will be reviewed by the Greater Chapin Community Endowment Committee of Central Carolina Community Foundation. Final funding decisions are made by the CCCF Board of Trustees.

TIMELINE

February 1st – Application Opens

February 29th – Application Closes

Late April – Applicants notified of application status (note: declinations will be emailed)

June 1 – Grant period begins

December 31 – Grant period ends
